Prayer for Christian Unity Sunday

Biblical Text: John 17:11-22

"...¹¹ And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. ¹² While I was with them, I protected them in your name that^[b] you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost,^[c] so that the scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³ But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves.^[d] ¹⁴ I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁵ I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one.^[e] ¹⁶ They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

²⁰ "I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, ²¹ that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us,^[] so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²² The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one…"

Notes for Worship Preparations

- Open Bible and Christ Candle on the altar.
- The worship mood will be hopeful and prayerful emphasizing the importance solemnity, with sincerity and dedication of prayers for the unity of all Christians around the world.

For a meaningful celebration at the end of worship during the prayer of dedication (*Collective Prayer for Christian Unity*), the congregation may form a big circle, while holding their hands. Now every single member (*including children if necessary*) may utter a **SINGLE WORD** that best describes their prayer for the Christian community. Until such time that all have taken their part in uttering the **WORD** that best represents their prayer. The pastor may consolidate the common and pressing words being mentioned several times and put in a summary prayer and end it together with **THE LORD'S PRAYER**.

Now for the benediction, everyone may say the words in the benediction litany or the pastor will utter the benediction and in response to the benediction the entire congregation will say the word "AMEN" in unison.

Short Reflection

The Church of God, as Christians, has the likeness of a family. A large family with diverse interests and tasks but united when approaching the table for food and discussing things related to relationships, desires, and life plans. Also, in the time of Jesus, he called his disciples who were not just fishermen. There was a tax collector, there was also a zealot (a group that opposed the Romans). They are both different. We see here that even if there were differences in viewpoints and principles among them, they argue but they never fight. Here we see that although they are different in origin, they are united in faith. It was a miracle. In our time, there are also existing groups that are exclusive (purely female, purely male) because there is the concern that because of different interests and mindsets, they would create conflicts that result to division.

As Paul says, without the nature of fellowship, and looking at the same desire will instead lead to trouble and no peace of mind. By the time the American missionaries arrived here in the Philippines, one of the ways to prevent quarrel among them was to assign jurisdictions. This is why the UCCP churches may have in some ways vary in its practices and traditions (Mindanao- Congregationalists; Visayas- Presbyterian; Luzon-Methodist/Disciples). But despite these differences, the missionaries were united in a common goal. And through them, we learned the lesson of unity in the presence of diversities. The missionaries taught us to accept one another, and learn how to appreciate our differences. These experiences from the past brought us to reflect on Christ's prayer for unity. It is his desire that "all may be one." Unity in short comes from the heart of Jesus. It is there where it finds its roots. But then, because of the fact that Jesus did pray for it, implies that it is not yet a reality. And we, as His followers, ought to fulfill that prayer and make it into reality. And that prayer of Jesus Christ is intended for us, handed down to us, as our task to act on.

The work for unity is tedious and challenging. We need to rise above our differences and come to the table to seek that which can change people's lives and work on things that will usher in the realization of God's reign.

Liturgist: Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not to quarrel over opinions.

People: Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables.

Liturgist: Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat; for God has welcomed them.

People: Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand.

Liturgist: Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike. Let all be fully convinced in their minds.

People: Those who observe the day, observe it in honor of the Lord. Also, those who eat, eat in honor of the Lord, since they give thanks to God; while those who abstain, abstain in honor of the Lord and give thanks to God.

Call to Confession (Liturgist)
